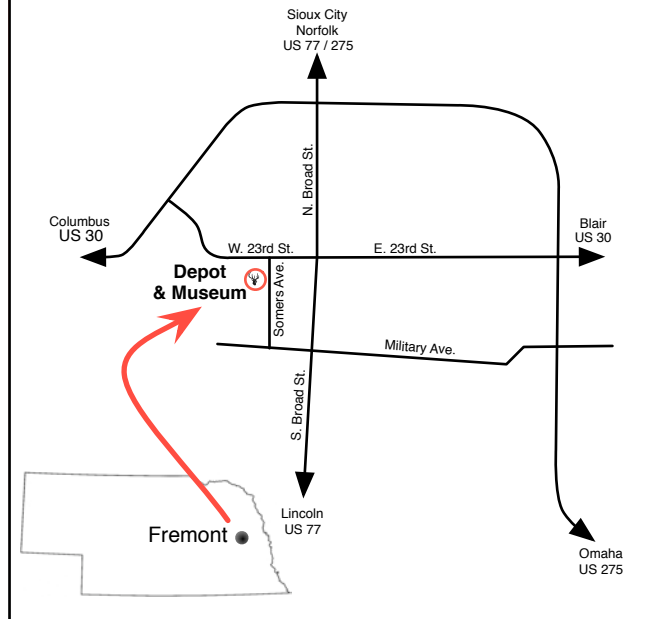

All aboard for a ride into history!

As you ride on the Fremont & Elkhorn Valley Railroad you'll take a trip back in time, when hardy Nebraska pioneers began settling the beautiful Elkhorn River valley.

Your trip begins as you depart from Fremont, founded in 1856 and the first major town along the route of the fledgling Union Pacific railroad. The strategic location of Fremont quickly made it a junction for the first three railroads built in Nebraska - the Union Pacific, the Sioux City & Pacific and the Fremont, Elkhorn & Missouri Valley (FE&MV), ancestor of today's Fremont & Elkhorn Valley Railroad.

Passing into the open countryside you'll enter the year 1869 when the FE&MV built its line north out of town on the way to western Nebraska, the ranches of Wyoming and the gold fields of the Black Hills. The roadbed you ride on today is the original line built by the FE&MV to take settlers to their new homes in the west and bring their farm produce back to eager buyers in Chicago and the cities of the east.

You'll also travel back to 1820 when you cross the path of the great explorer of the American West, Major Stephen Long as he passed through the Elkhorn River valley on his way west to reach the Rocky Mountains.

Arriving at your destination in Nickerson brings you to the year 1870 when the first segment of the Fremont, Elkhorn and Missouri Valley Railroad was completed with great ceremony, making it officially the third railroad to be built in the state of Nebraska.
